I trust you to lose me...Rose sent me a video of Lafemmebear singing this soulful haunting song at a concert performance of *The Red Shades* at El Rio in 2017, not too long before I considered coming to work at Z Space. At that time, I was also thinking about how to focus my personal activism on shared artistic explorations of identity. I had just conducted a rogue action as empathy experiment around gender and bathroom access, and I saw firsthand how a visceral, embodied experience can profoundly shift perspective in a way that facts and theory cannot. Amidst recent setbacks and threats to trans and queer rights around the country, it made perfect sense that it might take a rock opera to remind us of the power of our history, to inspire us to create the world we want to see, and to believe that world is possible.

More than five years later, here I am—a little trans kid who grew up in the 1970s and 80s in Texas—now one of the first openly trans leaders in the American theater. For me, *The Red Shades* still represents that trust in our collective strength—it is a glorious, heart-thumping tribute to trans superhero elders who risked so much to ensure an open place in society for people like me, and it is an anthem for the queer liberation yet to come. I am so proud to be a part of the loving and fierce community of artists on this journey to realize Adrienne's vision and finally share the world premiere production you are about to see.

In August 1966 a group of drag queens, queers, and people we might today consider to be trans women stood up to police oppression at Gene Compton's Cafeteria in the San Francisco Tenderloin. Forty-nine years later, in 2015, I saw Felicia "Flames" give a talk at the GLBT Museum called "Cruising the Tenderloin in the 60s." This was the first I had heard of the Compton's riot and of the kind of lives lived by queer and trans people in the 60's. I felt so inspired that I went through a phase of devouring any kind of trans history I could. Gradually it dawned on me that the collection of songs I had been writing for no particular reason were actually a rock opera about trans history. If only I could find the perfect metaphor to describe discovering the limits of your body, mind, and world only to transcend them...I decided that "superhero" would do in a pinch.

Years later I was lucky enough to work with our historical consultants, Felicia Elizondo and Andrea Horne, who had lived in San Francisco in the 60s. Whether or not this show captures what it was like to be a trans person in the 60s is not up to me to decide. But I can tell you that it brims with the energy of discovering your history as a trans person today and realizing, for the first time in your life, that you belong.

KB Boyce (Bass) (they/them/he) Multi-instrumentalist and digital media artist Kali KB Boyce is a Trans Masculine/NB performer whose adventures have brought them from teenage punk band appearances at CBGBs in NYC, to B-grade horror movies in LA, and on to solo *cross-dressing* blues performance as The Drag King of the Blues in San Francisco. Boyce composes and performs music that pays homage to African-American and Indigenous legacies of resistance through art. They conjure the spirit of

cross-dressing Blues performers—reflecting the history, creativity, and aesthetics of the ancestors. KB is the drummer for The Homobiles—a Bay Area Trans centered music act. Their music documents the ache of longing, vivid childhood memories, and a life lived against the grain, blurring every boundary. Genesis grows music and food in the Bay Area and is the co-founder of the *I Need Space Queer Music Festival*, founded to support a diverse, international array of queer artists during the COVID-19 pandemic. Their debut album, *Genesis*

Fermin, was released in 2021 and produced by Gina Villalobos, and the "gentle acoustic rhythms" on this album are described by Americana UK as "smartly written, [with] a strong vocal."



Fureigh (Guitar) (they/them) is a multi-instrumentalist and songwriter who "shreds melodically," according to *Rolling Stone*. After touring internationally, recording three critically acclaimed albums, and securing an opening slot on an Against Me! tour as part of the Brooklyn-based queer rock band the Shondes, Fureigh returned to the Bay Area and co-founded the Homobiles—"the Bay's mainstay queer party punk supergroup" (East Bay Express)—with punk trailblazer Lynn Breedlove. The Homobiles

headlined the Justin-Vivian-Bond-curated New York Live Arts Festival and have shared the stage with the likes of Pansy Division and Team Dresch. Their most recent single—a

queer-police-focused version of "Which Side Are You On?"—was featured on Bandcamp's homepage.

Fureigh has busked with Margaret Cho, played a Castro leatherman in *San Francisco Transgender Film Festival* centerpiece *Lou – A San Francisco Fantasy*, organized the all-ages outdoor trans- and queercore festival *There's a Chicken in the Pit!*, composed commissions for theatrical productions and book releases, and been recruited into the band Middle-Aged Queers ("FYP on poppers" –Maximum Rocknroll). Fureigh is currently working on a debut solo album about hopeful love, collective grief, and staying alive even when it hurts. Daniel Hall (Audio Mixer) is a Korean, Queer, Bay Area artist.
